Space voyage

SPACE CENTRE, Houston, Tues. — Apollo 13 astronauts described their space voyage from launch to splashdown today in a tape recorded session with space experts.

Major thrust

SAIGON, Tues. — Two thousand South Vietnamese troops, tanks and armoured personnel carriers thrust into Cambodia yesterday in the third major offensive across the border in the past week and killed 144 North Vietnamese and Viet Cong troops, informed sources said today.

ROME, Tues. — A new onset of strikes was upon Italy today closing, among other things, the municipal office of Rome and most other northern cities for 48 hours.

PNM fraud to stave off defeat



JUST WOKE UP

MR. BHADASE MARAJ, Democratic Labour Party, leader, and president-general of the All Trinidad Sugar Estates and Factory Workers' Trade Union, said today that it was too early for him to make any comment, since he had just got up from bed.

THE OPPOSITION Democratic Labour Party was not consulted or "even told" by Government of the declaration of state of emergency in the country, Mr. Vernon Jamadar (right), the Party's leader declared this morning.

Mr. Jamadar said: "We heard of it as everyone else, on the radio."

He stated that it was the Government's obligation to consult the Opposition on the matter and that his party's cabinet would meet after midday today in Port-of-Spain to discuss the matter.

He said: "I dispute the ground given for the state of emergency for it is clearly political and not for security reasons."

Mr. Jamadar said that "it is the same PNM fraudulence that proclaimed a state of emergency in DLP areas when they were faced with a political defeat in 1961 and this, coupled with their great concern to keep Caroni Limited on the backs of sugar workers, obviously led the Government to act unilaterally and without justification."

The Opposition leader declared: "It is not the first time that a state of emergency has been declared to prevent sugar workers from liberating themselves



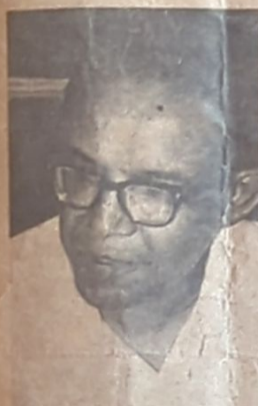
EXTREME CRISIS

DR. JAMES MILLETTE (right), leader of the United National Independence Party (UNIP) said: (UNIP) aid:

"The present crisis is a political crisis of the most extreme sort and it is clear that everyone is now faced with an important moral decision relating to his position as an individual."

"Quite clearly, we can no longer continue to determine what we will or will not do according to the precepts laid down by a Government which is unashamedly using the instruments of state to resolve its own political difficulties."

"Time will tell whether true morality will prevail or whether we will allow ourselves once more to be curbed into surrendering even more of our manhood."



OPEN SHOW OF FASCISM

MR. PETER FARQUHAR, (left) leader of the Liberal Party has branded the state of national emergency as an open show of "fascism." He said: "It is quite clear now that we are living under a fascist dictatorship."

He pointed out that this was quite clear to him since 1961. He offered no concrete solutions to the problem, but stated that "the only thing that is warranted in these circumstances is for the Prime Minister and his Cabinet to get out!"
