PNM fraud stave

THE OPPOSITION Democratic Labour Party was not consulted or "even told" by Government of the declaration of state of excretency in the country, Mr. Vernon Jamadar (right), the Party's leader declared this morning.

Mr. Jamadar said: "We heard of it as everyone else, on the radio."

He stated that it was the Government's obligation to consult the Opposition on the matter and that his party's cabinet would meet after midday today in Port-of-Spain to discuss the matter.

He said: "I dispute the ground given for the state of emergency for it is clearly political and not for security reasons."

Mr. Jamadar said that "it is the same PNM fraudulence that proclaimed a state of emergency in DLP areas when they were faced with a political defeat in 1961 and this, coupled with their great concern to keep Caroni Limited on the backs of sugar workers, obviously leit the Government to act unllaterally and without justification."
